Congratulations to faculty, staff, graduate students, and research trainees from the *Canadian Centre for Advanced Practice Nursing Research* (CCAPNR) for the continued success and accomplishments spanning the last 4.5 years.

Since CCAPNR's inception in 2011, CCAPNR has continued to build on our School of Nursing's long tradition, of leading and promoting the development of specialized and advanced nursing roles. CCAPNR's accomplishments demonstrate successful research capacity building resulting from Dr. Alba DiCenso's CHSRF/CIHR Chair in Advanced Practice Nursing at McMaster (2001-2011). With over \$19 million in funding since 2016, CCAPNR has continued to expand its research, education, and knowledge translation enterprise with provincial, national, and international impact. A major strength of CCAPNR's impact and reach is the commitment and collaboration amongst the faculty who represent five universities across three provinces.

The breadth of CCAPNR's impact is impressive with initiatives extending across five continents and 12 countries and accessible to almost every province in Canada. Research has examined the introduction and impact of Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) and Nurse Practitioner (NP) roles for a broad range of patient populations in varied settings. Initiatives have aided to advance education, improve health policies, and spur the initial introduction of CNS and NP roles in several countries. CCAPNR continues to be a leader in knowledge translation in this field through its development of tools and products to support the optimal development, implementation, and evaluation of advanced nursing roles. As global leaders in their field, CCAPNR faculty are frequently sought out as keynote speakers at conferences and policy forums around the world and consistently demonstrated a high level of productivity in peer reviewed publications and presentations. Finally, and importantly, CCAPNR faculty provide international leadership to develop and mentor the next generation of researchers who will further advance the utilization of specialized and advanced practice nurses around the world.

In this tumultuous year that recognizes the essential contribution of nurses for improving global health, CCAPNR's work is even more poignant. I look forward to CCAPNR's continued success in the years ahead.

Message from the Chief Executive Officer, Canadian Nurses Association

For the past four years, the Canadian Centre for Advanced Practice Nursing Research (CCAPNR) has continued to demonstrate tremendous leadership in advanced practice nursing research, specialized nursing roles and practice. The organization generates key sources of evidence, provides education and mentorship, and informs decision-makers from Canada and internationally on the essential role of advanced practice nurses (APNs).

The World Health Organization designated 2020 as the International Year of the Nurse and the Midwife. The work of APNs is recognized by the International Council of Nurses (ICN) as essential to address global health challenges. APNs are an effective and efficient resource to ensure quality health care remains accessible and affordable. This report strongly supports optimization of nursing practice. Some of the proposed actions include supporting nurse-led models of care with advanced practice roles, leveraging opportunities arising from digital health technology, and considering aging patterns within the nursing workforce. Many of these issues are currently being evaluated by CCAPNR.

The ICN Guidelines on Advanced Practice Nursing were available this year and facilitate a common understanding of advanced practice nursing and the APN for external stakeholders. The ICN guidelines were informed by evidence published by CCAPNR, marking a proud moment for Canadian nurses. This demonstrates firsthand the impact of CCAPNR on global policies.

The Canadian Nurses Association (CNA) applauds the significant accomplishments of the CCAPNR research team for the creation of new evidence showcasing the essential role of APNs in Canada and globally. CCAPNR is contributing to the growing body of evidence showcasing the contribution of advanced practice nursing and how these roles contribute to better care, better value and best outcomes.

CNA believes that researchers are essential to identify knowledge gaps and establish research priorities in conjunction with clinicians and other health professionals, key stakeholders and client groups. Researchers generate high-quality evidence, facilitate capacity-building of new nurse researchers, and engage in effective knowledge transfer, translation and exchange to communicate relevant research findings to those who need it.

CNA continues to support the development of advanced practice roles — including the clinical nurse specialist and nurse practitioner — to ensure the nursing workforce is evolving to reflect the health-care needs of Canadians. However, in Canada we have not been able to fully optimize these roles to best meet changing populations and complex community care needs. The CNA Advanced Practice Nursing: A Pan-Canadian Framework highlights the importance of being able to present evidence on the contribution of APN roles to patients and health systems. We need to continue to demonstrate the impact of new advanced practice models to meet the current needs during the pandemic. CNA is pleased to continue to collaborate and support CCAPNR work to generate timely, responsive and meaningful evidence needed to advance advanced practice nursing and inform health policy decisions.

Introduction

The Canadian Centre for Advanced Practice Nursing (CCAPNR) is Canada's foremost research network devoted to advancing the field of advanced practice nursing (APN) and specialized nursing roles and practice. Regarded as a leader in APN research, policy, and knowledge translation, CCAPNR has distinguished itself nationally and internationally as a centre of excellence that conducts research and evaluation, provides education and mentorship to clinicians and early investigators, and collaborates with organizations and decision makers to inform health policy.

This report highlights the activities and accomplishments of CCAPNR from July 2016 to June 2020. In this document we also reflect on what we have learned as an alliance and chart future directions for CCAPNR.



History

CCAPNR evolved from the Chair in Advanced Practice Nursing (APN) held by Alba DiCenso. This Chair was funded by a 10-year award co-sponsored by the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, and the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (2001-2011).

The mandate of this Chair was to increase Canada's capacity of nurse researchers who would conduct applied research related to APN through education and mentorship, research, and linkage and exchange.

Most of CCAPNR's core faculty were research trainees in the APN Chair Program.



Who We Are

We are a group of multi-disciplinary researchers dedicated to creating new solutions for problems that challenge health and social services through the use of new models of care and evaluation.

Our research team is based at McMaster University in Hamilton, Ontario and includes faculty from Dalhousie University, Ryerson University, Queen's University, Western University, McGill University, and the University of Eastern Finland.

CCAPNR works with a range of stakeholders and community partners including federal and provincial governments, health care organizations, and research units working both nationally and internationally.



Our Vision

Through research and leadership, and in partnership with national and international stakeholders, we will improve health and health services by advancing the nursing care provided to society.



Our Mission and Values

Goals

To provide a national and international forum to identify, discuss, consult, and debate on important policies and other issues relevant to the education, development, and utilization of specialized and advanced nursing roles.

To conduct timely, responsive, and meaningful research that informs decision making about the education, development, and utilization of specialized and advanced nursing roles in Canada.

To lead a broad range of knowledge translation activities that support the design, conduct, dissemination, and utilization of high-quality research about nursing roles and models of care delivery in Canada and internationally.

To support the development of advanced nursing roles and related research through consultation with key stakeholders and the education and mentorship of undergraduate and graduate students, advanced practice nurses, and early investigators.



Objectives

To improve patient health, quality of care, and healthcare utilization and costs through research and knowledge translation activities that inform nursing practice and the effective use of specialized and advanced nursing roles in chronic disease prevention and management in collaboration with provincial, national, and international stakeholders.

To promote faculty and staff development through education and external consultation and guidance for the development of new or ongoing research or other related initiatives.

To provide national stakeholders with consultation and guidance on new or ongoing research or other nursing and APN related initiatives.

To provide and maximize the use of staff and practical resources to support the conduct of research and knowledge translation activities.

To provide opportunities to promote stakeholder understanding of the effective development and use of specialized and advanced nursing roles through education and knowledge translation.

To provide a forum for manuscript review and development and the submission of abstracts for peer reviewed presentations.

To promote team collaboration, cooperation, and support for joint research.

Denise Bryant-Lukosius
McMaster University

Focus: Improving access and quality of care and health outcomes for underserved populations through the optimal implementation and evaluation of specialized and advanced nursing roles.

Impact: As co-Director, Dr. Bryant-Lukosius has led the expansion of CCAPNR and its work related to the national and international development of advanced nursing practice. Through research, she has informed key policy documents and developed evidenced-based frameworks and tools used around the world to improve APN role implementation and evaluation. As Director for the Canadian Centre for Excellence in Oncology Advanced Practice Nursing (OAPN) at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre, she has conducted research to improve cancer nursing practice and models of care and led provincial and national oncology APN mentorship and education initiatives to build research capacity and support role development.



Ruth Martin-Misener
Dalhousie University

Focus: Evaluation of the implementation and outcomes of innovative models of team-based care with a particular focus on advanced and specialized nursing roles in primary health care and long-term care.

Impact: Dr. Martin-Misener is a co-Director of CCAPNR. She is a recognized knowledge broker for key stakeholders and decision makers and her research has been widely used to inform policy related to nurse practitioner scope of practice, education, regulation and deployment across sectors and populations. Several of her published articles have been cited in key policy documents such as the World Health Organization's State of the World's Nursing (2020), the International Council of Nurses' Guidelines on APN (2020), the Canadian Nurses' Association's APN: A Pan-Canadian Framework (2019) and Position Statement on the Nurse Practitioner (2016), the Canadian Council of Nurse Regulators NP Practice Analysis and the Nova Scotia Nurses Union report on long-term care, Broken Homes. She is the recipient of several provincial, national, and international awards and distinctions including a Fellowship in the American Academy of Nursing in 2019 and appointment as a Charter Fellow in the Canadian Academy of Nursing in 2020.



Nancy Carter
McMaster University

Focus: Systems navigation, knowledge translation and exchange, nursing leadership, and graduate nursing education.

Impact: Dr. Carter holds expertise in knowledge translation and has a focus on the dissemination and uptake of evidence on clinical nurse specialists and nurse practitioners by administrators and decision makers, as well as the development of new nursing roles in oncology and community settings. Her experience working with diverse stakeholders is a valuable asset to the CCAPNR team's knowledge translation objectives.



Faith Donald
Ryerson University

Focus: Nurse practitioners in primary and long-term care, nurse practitioner graduate education, economic analysis of APN roles, and evidence-based practice.

Impact: Dr. Donald brings extensive experience with curriculum design and evaluation to the CCAPNR team. Dr. Donald continues to practice as a primary health care nurse practitioner and has a background that stretches across acute, long-term and primary health care settings.



Krista Jokiniemi
University of Eastern Finland

Focus: The development of the clinical nurse specialist role, competencies, and capabilities.

Impact: Through Dr. Jokiniemi's research program a clinical nurse specialist competency scale has been developed and tested within Nordic countries. In addition, Dr. Jokiniemi's research program has impacted the specialist and APN role delineation in Canada. Currently, Dr. Jokiniemi is contributing to the differentiation of specialist, clinical nurse specialist, and APN roles internationally.



Kelley Kilpatrick
McGill University

Focus: Team processes to open the 'black box' of how APN roles support teams and improve care.

Impact: Dr. Kilpatrick's research program aims to support the implementation of APN roles in Québec and internationally (France, Spain, Finland). Dr. Kilpatrick's research also aims to optimize functioning in inter-professional teams that include advanced practice nurses. We developed and validated instruments that measure perspectives of patients, families, and providers. The inclusion of patients and families as members of the healthcare team is an innovation that will provide new insights into how to foster patient involvement in care and improve outcomes. Our research team's work highlights the critical influence of team processes (e.g., communication, care coordination) and role clarity on outcomes of care.



Jennifer Rayner
Association of Ontario
Health Centres

Focus: Health service research focused on team-based primary care and health equity.

Impact: Dr. Rayner's research program has informed the effective implementation of team-based primary care in Ontario. Her research aims to optimize electronic medical record content standards and sociodemographic/race-based data to improve patient care and reduce health inequities. She is working across Canada to study the impact of multi-disciplinary teams in primary care. Her experience working with diverse stakeholders including policy makers is a valuable asset to the CAPPNR team's knowledge translation objectives.



Diana Sherifali
McMaster University

Focus: Engaging individuals to effectively self-manage and mitigate the impact of diabetes on their life.

Impact: Dr. Sherifali's research has informed the effective implementation of health coaching in various settings; identified predictors to determine best practices and optimize patient, clinical, and population outcomes; and informed and refined diabetes technology enabled coaching (D-TEC) interventions with up-to-date evidence. Future work will include: 1) the feasibility and applicability of digitally enabled health coaching in other chronic conditions; 2) examining the role of artificial intelligence and machine learning to support individuals and population-based health through precision engagement, monitoring and accountability; and 3) forging networks of pan-Canadian and international inter-professional researchers, healthcare providers, trainees and other stakeholders engaged in health coaching and digital solutions to improve the lives of individuals living with or at risk for chronic illness.



Joan Tranmer
Queen's University

Focus: Health services research program exploring optimization of the nursing role and contribution to chronic disease prevention and management.

Impact: Dr. Tranmer has a health services research program with two foci; 1) understanding the health care needs and optimizing the care of persons with complex chronic illness conditions, and 2) understanding the relationships between work related factors, such as shift work patterns, and cardiovascular and cancer risk. She has research expertise in the conduct of cohort and intervention studies, and in the use of health administrative databases. Her research has been supported by several granting bodies, including the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) and the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term. She has published in a wide range of scientific journals and has successfully supervised and mentored graduate students.



Ruta Valaitis
McMaster University

Focus: Navigation, public health, primary health care, collaboration, and health systems integration

Impact: Dr. Valaitis' research contributions straddle a variety of content areas essential to contemporary approaches in the public health and primary health care sphere (policy research, interprofessional collaboration, implementation science, community-based care, and e-health). Dr. Valaitis' experience in implementing public health policy in British Columbia and Ontario exemplify her experience in managing large interprovincial, inter-disciplinary teams, measuring impacts, and integrating knowledge exchange processes within the health care policy sector.



Erin Ziegler
Ryerson University

Focus: Improving access and quality healthcare for LGBTQ2SA individuals, nurse practitioners in primary care and nurse practitioner graduate education.

Impact: Dr. Ziegler's research involves exploring healthcare access and delivery to vulnerable populations, including the LGBTQ2SA population. Additionally, her research focuses on role optimization of nurse practitioners in primary care and graduate nursing education. Dr. Ziegler continues to practice as a primary healthcare nurse practitioner.

Focus: APN, immigrants and refugee's health, and nursing education.

Impact: Salma's work focuses on APN role development and implementation in Arab countries in the Eastern Mediterranean region. Salma is a PhD candidate at Dalhousie University. Her PhD thesis focuses on the role development and utilization of master's prepared Omani nurses. She is also interested in immigrant and refugees' health, especially those from Arab descent. She contributes by providing a culturally sensitive lens to their unique needs to improve service provision for them.



Linda Brousseau

Focus: Public health, health promotion and disease prevention.

Impact: In addition to her role as a nurse practitioner at the Halton Sexual Health and Needle Exchange, Linda is a PhD student at McMaster University completing a thesis on the implementation of models of sexual health programs in public health.



Andrea Carson
Dalhousie University

Focus: Reproductive health services using qualitative, social theory frameworks.

Impact: Dr. Carson's work centres on challenging implicit assumptions about reproductive health care in Canada in order to improve health services and experiences for marginalized populations. She contributes to interprofessional and interdisciplinary teams by bringing a sociological lens to health services research, grounding discussions of health and wellbeing in their socio-historical and institutionalized contexts. Reflexivity is an important aspect of this work, an ongoing and active practice in which researchers continuously question their assumptions and perspectives in order to better listen to patient and provider needs. The impact of her most recent work with the Contraception and Abortion Research Team (CART) is in developing new knowledge about medication abortion provision in Canada in order to support the role of nurse practitioners to provide this service within their communities.



Carole Michalski-Monnerat
University of Lausanne

Focus: Systematic approaches to the design, implementation, and evaluation of transitional models of care.

Impact: Ms Michalski-Monnerat is a clinical nurse specialist from Switzerland where she works in the area of internal medicine at the Neuchâtel Hospital Network. She is also a PhD student at the Institute of Higher Education and Research in Healthcare (IUFERS) at the University of Lausanne and is co-supervised by Dr. Cedric Mabire and Dr. Denise Bryant-Lukosius. Her thesis work will provide a roadmap for the use of systematic approaches to design, implement, and evaluate new models of care involving advanced practice nurses in Switzerland. In particular, she will collaborate with key stakeholders in her research to design a transitional model of care for hospitalized older adults that is relevant to the Swiss health care system.

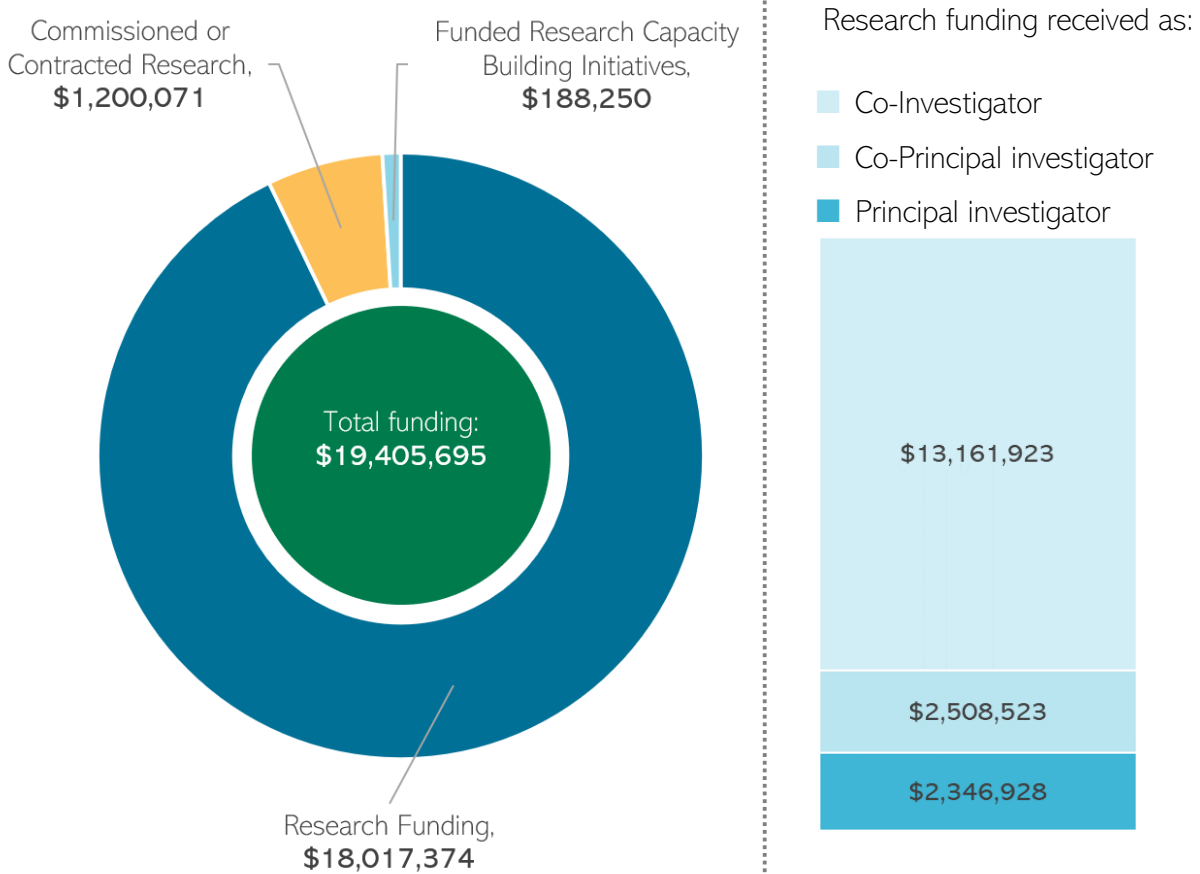

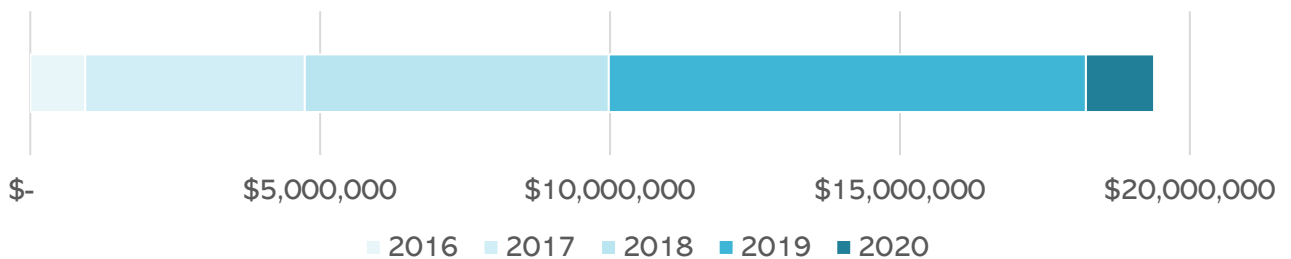

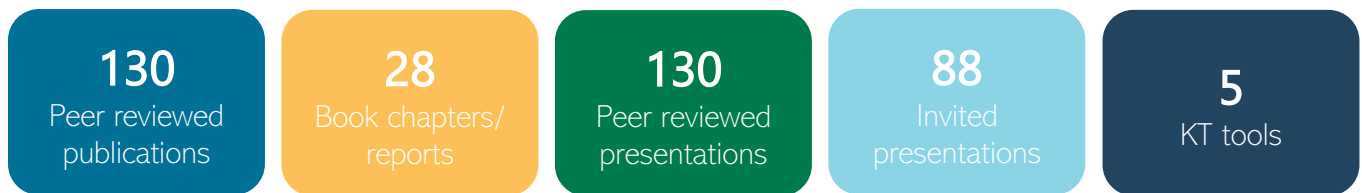

Since 2011, our small group of researchers has expanded to include a diverse collaborative of scientists, early investigators, and students committed to improving people's health in varied contexts through the optimization of nursing roles. Our passion to improve health has been a key driver, but what has sustained this challenging work and contributed to our collective success has been teamwork, mutual respect, and a spirit of cooperation and genuine support of each other's personal and professional growth. Perhaps the most meaningful and important aspect of the last 4 years has been collaborations with colleagues from around the world. They have inspired us, stretched our minds, and expanded our understanding of specialized and advanced nursing roles and the opportunities they can create to improve health.

Future Directions for CCAPNR

The World Health Organization's 2020 report on the state of the world's nursing provides foundational recommendations for advancing our future work. This report outlines unprecedented needs to i) expand the use of specialized and advanced nursing roles to improve access to care and to address health inequalities, ii) improve the implementation of innovative nursing roles and models of care, and iii) to generate evidence about the cost-effectiveness of nursing roles and innovations. International, pan-country approaches will be essential to support the education and introduction of specialized and advanced nursing roles, especially in countries with limited resources. Our experiences in developing successful international partnerships and collaborations over the past four years have well-positioned CCAPNR faculty to respond to this global need to strengthen the role of nurses in health systems around the world.
